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
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## Uses of Surveillance Data

- Laboratory Reports
- Patient Tracking Data
- Child Specific Environmental Data
- Medicaid Linking Results

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## Sources of Data for Evaluation

- Surveillance Data
- Housing /Tax Assessor Data
- EPA or HUD
- Medicaid, WIC, other children's programs
- Special Studies
  - HITS
  - Sentinel Neighborhoods
- Surveys

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## Logic Model

- Logic model is a graphic depiction of the relationship between a program's activities and it intended effects.
- Logic models depict intention and not what is actually occurring.
  - When we set up a program, what did we hope the results would be if things went well?

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## Logic Model

- Describes the program.
- Helps make decisions about where to focus program evaluation at any one time.

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## Logic Model

- Key elements that are usually included in a logic model:
  - Inputs,
  - Activities,
  - Outputs, and...
  - Effects.
    - **Outcomes or impacts, the ways in which someone or something other than the program itself is expected to change.**

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## Logic Model

- Two Principal Evaluation Efforts
  - Process Evaluation
    - Are you implementing your activity or intervention correctly (as per intended plan)?
  - Outcome Evaluation
    - Are my activities having impact or effects?
